

Abstract

The Village Consultative Body (BPD) is an organizational institution that carries out the functions of village government whose members are representatives of the village population based on the representation of the village area. The Village Consultative Body (BPD) has a partner with the village head, where this institution serves as an element of village government organizers. The Village Consultative Body (BPD) has the function of discussing and agreeing on draft village regulations with the Village Head, accommodating and channeling the aspirations of the village community, and supervising the performance of the Village Head. This research was conducted in Sidorejo Village, RimboIlir District, Tebo Regency. This study aims to determine the extent to which the results of the evaluation of the BPD function in carrying out supervision of village governance in Sidorejo Village. The aspects studied broadly include the BPD's supervisory function in organizing village governance and what has been done by the BPD to help organize village governance from the theory of supervision according to Robert J. Mockler's theory. The research method used is descriptive qualitative, with data collection in the form of observation, interviews and documentation. The results of this study indicate that the evaluation of the BPD function in supervising the performance of the village head has been carried out. BPD has carried out its functions as much as possible. However, there are several functions that have not been carried out properly, such as the lack of community participation in channeling community aspirations. In this case, it is hoped that the BPD will be active in carrying out its functions.
